After calling 911, a volunteer fire department arrived on the scene, but Rebekah and Trenton remained, providing invaluable assistance and collaborating with the firefighters to continue CPR and offer advanced care. When an ambulance arrived from the company they work for, Rebekah went above and beyond by volunteering to accompany the patient to the hospital. She continued to assist in resuscitation efforts en route, displaying her commitment to the patient's survival despite being off duty. Outside of work Trenton enjoys woodworking, fishing and surfing. Jared Armstrong Paramedic Falck

Paramedic Jared Armstrong, a six-year veteran of Falck Alameda County, is receiving the CAA Star of Life award for his exceptional lifesaving efforts after successfully reviving a 15-year-old patient who suffered cardiac arrest at a local soccer field. Responding within minutes, Armstrong and partner immediately assessed the situation and initiated high-quality CPR. Their rapid intervention, combined with the precise ALS interventions including defibrillation and pharmaceutical interventions, led to the return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) before arrival at the hospital. Their seamless teamwork and advanced prehospital care played a critical role in giving the patient a second chance at life. This patient is fully recovered and working toward returning the soccer field again. Their actions exemplify the highest standards of emergency medical care – turning a dire situation into a story of survival. Their dedication and expertise continue to make a profound impact on Alameda County EMS.



Dennis Ayzenberg EMT Medic Ambulance Service

Dennis Ayzenberg has been with Medic Ambulance since October 2022 and is being recognized as a Star of Life for the patient care he provided after he and his partner witnessed a car accident. Dennis and his partner were on their way to Kaiser South for a transfer and witnessed a rollover accident with multiple patients ejected. The team jumped into action and split up to care for both patients until fire arrived. CPR was started on the female patient, and assessment completed on the male critical patient. Once Fire arrived on scene, Ayzenberg rode in the ambulance with the female patient, performing CPR with fire. When asked how he knew healthcare was the right career path for him, Dennis explains, "For me, EMS confirmed that healthcare was the right career for me. I've been on the route towards medical school since high school, and becoming an EMT after graduating from college was an opportunity for me to gain hands-on experience and confirm that I truly want to be in the medical field. Being able to make a positive impact for my patients both as a medical provider and as an advocate has confirmed that passion and continues to motivate me forward in my journey in healthcare." When asked what he likes most about working for Medic Ambulance, Dennis says, "Working at Medic Ambulance has allowed me to truly feel like I'm serving my community in Sacramento whether it's during an emergent transport to the ER, discharge from the hospital, or a high school football game standby. This variety of services Medic Ambulance is involved in has allowed me to develop my skills as an EMT and confirm that being a healthcare provider is what I want to do the rest of my life. Charlie Finnell
Paramedic
American Medical
Response

Charlie Finnell is a dedicated paramedic with over 20 years of field service. He has worked as an advanced life support paramedic in both the fire service and ground ambulance operations. He consistently serves his community with integrity, compassion, and an unwavering dedication to emergency care when they need him most. On the evening of January 27th, Mr. Finnell arrived at the scene of a multi-patient rollover car accident with this mindset. He was the first provider on scene, encountering a mangled, overturned vehicle with three patients – one of whom was still trapped inside. Without hesitation, he sprang into action, providing a scene size-up, requesting additional resources, and approaching the vehicle to rescue the most critical patient. Inside the wreckage, a patient was curled up in a ball, barely alive, with blood pooled around her. With the help of police officers and his partner, Mr. Finnell carefully extricated the patient from the back of the vehicle using a backboard. During the rescue, he saw that the patient's left arm was nearly severed at the shoulder. Feeling a weak, slow pulse, he immediately began providing manual rescue breaths with a bag valve mask while his partner packed the shoulder wound with pressure dressings to stop the bleeding. Acting swiftly, Mr. Finnell intubated the patient, started a large-bore IV in a proximal vein, drilled intraosseous (IO) access, and began administering fluids through the IO line, along with TXA through the IV. Life Flight was activated, but as the helicopter was en route, he recognized that the patient was entering decompensatory shock and beginning to dislodge the endotracheal tube. He quickly contacted the base hospital and received orders for push-dose epinephrine to shunt blood to vital organs, as well as Versed to sedate the patient and improve ventilation. The patient's blood pressure and pulse rate increased, pulling them out of decompensatory shock. Charlie administered three more rounds of push-dose epinephrine, not only keeping the critical patient alive but significantly improving their overall outcome. Thanks to his exceptional skills, quick thinking, and unwavering dedication, he successfully stabilized the patient until the air ambulance arrived, where they immediately received a blood transfusion. Despite his extraordinary efforts, Charlie took no credit for the rescue. Instead, he selflessly dedicated the success of the call to his partner, the police officers, and the fire department, expressing gratitude for the opportunity to help someone in their darkest hour. His actions embody true selflessness – demonstrating that his only concern was saving a life, not seeking recognition. \star



Daniela Flores Valencia Paramedic **Medic Ambulance** Service

Daniela Flores Valencia joined the Medic team in December 2015. When asked how she knew EMS was the right field for her, Daniela explains, "I can't say that I decided that this was the career for me. The patient was transferred to a reattachment facility in San Francisco. 🖈

At 3:16 PM on January 23, 2025, AMR Medic 264, staffed by EMT Jeff Guevara and Paramedic Paul McKee, was assigned to a first-alarm structure fire response in their district. Medic 264 is housed at a fire station. A few minutes before the structure fire response, the engine at their station was dispatched to a "Smoke Check" on the other end of the district. Medic 264 was the first unit to arrive on the scene and reported a large amount of smoke coming from the roof. The incident was then upgraded to a "Working Structure Fire." As Medic 264 exited their vehicle, they were met by neighbors who said that someone might still be inside the structure. Paul and Jeff, a well-coordinated team, approached the front door, which was locked, and began banging on it. Meanwhile, Jeff walked around the back of the home and found a partially open sliding glass door with thick black smoke billowing out. He could hear someone calling for help from inside. Due to the heavy smoke, Jeff crouched low to see beneath the smoke layer. He spotted intense flames in the kitchen area and what appeared to be a victim on the couch. With no fire personnel yet on the scene and the victim in critical condition, Jeff made the split-second decision to enter the home despite the hazardous conditions. He managed to pull the victim off the couch, move him toward the sliding glass door, and assist him in getting to his feet. Both Jeff and the patient were soaked from the fire sprinkler system. The victim was barely conscious, gasping for air, and had singed eyebrows, eyelashes, and nose hair. Recognizing the severity of the patient's condition, Jeff immediately began assisting Paramedic McKee with assessment and treatment – all while still soaking wet, coughing, and recovering from the intense smoke and heat. His ability to maintain composure and coordinate patient care under such perilous conditions is a testament to his professionalism and dedication. Due to the patient's critical state, the crew quickly transported him to UCSD Burn Center, over 30 minutes away. Jeff's selfless actions, putting his own safety aside to save a life, exemplify his unwavering commitment to his role as an EMT. The patient's injuries indicated that, without Jeff's courageous intervention, he most likely would have perished in the fire.

On January 7, 2025, after a full day of work, Corey Martin, a Critical Care Paramedic with over 28 years of experience, answered an urgent call from Pasadena requesting assistance in evacuating a skilled nursing facility and an adjacent assisted living center – both directly in the path of the rapidly advancing Eaton Fire. Drawing on decades of expertise, Martin swiftly mobilized resources, convened an emergency meeting with the management team and dispatch, and recalled all available personnel. Within just 52 minutes, 25 units were on scene, actively participating in the massive evacuation of 262 residents. Demonstrating exceptional leadership, Martin coordinated efforts from within the incident, working alongside his team on the ground. With his trusted canine partner, Dozer, he conducted a final sweep of the facilities to ensure no one was left behind. This operation marked the beginning of an unprecedented week of service to the communities of Altadena, Pasadena, Santa Monica, and La Crescenta Valley. Immediately following the successful Eaton Fire evacuation, Martin and his team shifted gears to respond to the Palisades Fire on the Santa Monica border. Once again, he led the evacuation of a second facility, overseeing the safe relocation of 87 patients while managing a fleet of 57 vehicles, including ALS and BLS ambulances, as well as gurney vans from multiple agencies. With only a few hours of rest, Martin and his team were back in action, responding to a third facility's request for evacuation in the Crescenta Valley area. By the end of the week, a total of 647 patient movements had taken place, including both initial evacuations and repatriations. Throughout this intense period, Martin's steadfast leadership, hands-on approach, and unwavering commitment to his crews inspired the entire team to operate at the highest level. With nearly three decades of experience in critical care and emergency response, Corey Martin exemplifies the very best of emergency medical services, proving that true leadership is forged in the heart of the crisis. \star


