

Dana put the patients' needs before his own and offered to stay as long as needed to run this important call. Dana's actions illustrate our values and the care we have for our patients here at ProTransport-1 as well as the character we in EMS must exemplify.

Paramedic Matthew Cullen and his partner responded as a Multiple ALS unit and Engine response to a two-vehicle head on collision with multiple patients and a fatality. Matthew and Daniel were on medic xx and their patient was a 29-year-old 10-week pregnant female with her first pregnancy. The patient was found supine on the pavement upon their arrival, complaining of back, pelvic, and abdominal pain. The patient was a restrained, rear seat passenger. Upon assessment, the patient had a tender lower abdomen and pain to the touch of the pelvic region. Bruising and crepitus was noted during the exam. The patient was packaged quickly with attention to supporting her hips during transport. The patient was taken to the trauma center to meet the trauma team for admission. Mr. Cullen, a paramedic with Falck San Diego, has a passion to serve others and to do his best to impact people in a positive way. He grew up around public service his mother was a sheriff's deputy, and his father was a firefighter, both for over 30 years. With a strong belief in serving others and making a difference, Matt serves as an instructor at a local paramedic program as well as a preceptor for paramedic students at Falck. He is also a member of the Falck Peer Support Team. Off duty, Matt enjoys fishing, paddleboarding, lobster diving, and operating a side business making beef jerky. 🏶



Anthony Dana EMT Royal Ambulance

Anthony Dana started his career at Royal in August of 2022 as an EMT with goals of being accepted into a fire program. His incredible drive to perform at a high level, both with his clinical knowledge/skills and professionalism, quickly put him on the map with Operations as a future healthcare leader. He works very closely with Operations providing continual feedback on how to improve processes within his home county in San Francisco to ensure that his peers have the best experience possible. He recognized that this was far from ordinary and made the decision to divert to the closest facility, hundreds of miles from his home county. With his guick decision-making skills and medical knowledge, he was able to make the appropriate interventions to keep the patient as stable as possible, and ensured a safe transport to a hospital where it was confirmed the patient was having an acute MI. Anthony's quick actions avoided a potentially deadly situation from happening, all due to his compassionate nature and attention to detail.





Jerry Darrow EMT American Legion Post No. 108 Ambulance

On the morning of December 4, 2022, Medic 2 was dispatched code 3 to a motor vehicle accident involving one vehicle. EMT Jerry Darrow along with his partner Paramedic David Kolet-Mandrikov arrived on scene within six minutes of dispatch. On arrival, EMT Darrow immediately assisted a local Jackson police officer with CPR on the 66-year-old male driver. After aggressively working on the patient for over 20 minutes, return of spontaneous circulation was achieved, and the patient had a femoral pulse. The patient was placed in full spinal precautions and loaded for transport to the local hospital one mile down the street. The patient was treated at the local hospital and later flown to UC Davis Medical Center in Sacramento. The patient remained in the ICU on a ventilator for a week. The patient made good progress every day and eventually was discharged home with no deficits. It was determined that the patient had experienced a cardiac event prior to the vehicle accident. The quick actions of EMT Darrow and his partner led to the successful outcome of this patient.





Chalyssa David Paramedic Supervisor Medic Ambulance Service Chalyssa David was born in San Diego along with her two sisters and were raised by their grandparents in Santa Rosa. After high school, she decided she did not want to go to college even though she had been in a pre-college program throughout her high school years. She had multiple dreams of different careers like oceanography and child development, even aspiring to be a firefighter. At 19 she found out she was pregnant and moved to Yuba City. She had another child in 2012 and decided she needed a better job to financially take care of her two children. She then enrolled in EMT school to pursue a career as a firefighter. She fell in love with being an EMT on the ambulance and made the decision to go to paramedic school. Chalyssa was volunteering with a fire department, working 50+ hours a week on the ambulance, going to paramedic school and raising her two children. She has now been a paramedic for almost seven years and with the last six of those years with Medic Ambulance. In 2018, Chalyssa promoted to Paramedic Supervisor, and recently transferred from our Solano Operations to our Sacramento Division. She describes it as a rewarding career and loves that it sets a great example for her children. She is now married with five children and looks forward to the rest of her career helping those in need. During a seemingly routine interfacility transport, Chalyssa was managing a 34-week pregnant female patient in active labor. This was scheduled as a non-critical ALS transport going to a specialty mother and baby delivery unit in Roseville. Chalyssa was the only provider in the back with the mother, and per the sending facility, birth was not imminent, or so they thought. Prior to arrival at the patient's specialty center, the patient's active labor rapidly progressed, and the patient began delivering the baby in the back of the ambulance. Upon delivery, the umbilical cord was found to be wrapped around the baby's neck two times. The baby was blue and not breathing. Chalyssa was able to unwrap the umbilical cord and provide immediate resuscitation measures. The baby then began crying and Chalyssa safely oversaw the completion of the transport of mom and baby. Upon follow-up the baby is doing fine with no deficits. This amazing act is just one of the reasons we are honoring Chalyssa for a Star of Life! Great job, Chalyssa! 🍁





Michael Davis Paramedic American Ambulance

Michael Davis was selected by his American Ambulance peers as Paramedic of the Year in 2022 for Fresno County Operations. Mike Davis came to American Ambulance in August of 1983 as an EMT-B. EMT Katya Rybikov and EMT Jordan Dombrowsky responded Code 3 as a backup unit for a CPR in progress to an unresponsive patient. Upon arrival and after quick patient assessment, EMT Dombrowsky began immediate compressions. In coordination with an additional AlphaOne unit, EMT Lin and Paramedic Whittlesey arrived on scene. Paramedic Whittlesey took over primary patient care and reassessed EMT duties on scene. He instructed EMT Rybikov to place pad on and insert IGEL, and for EMT Lin to prepare the four-lead on the patient. Paramedic Whittlesey delivered a shock to the patient, then compressions were continued. After multiple attempts to regain pulses, a change in rhythm occurred, but patient remained pulseless. Another shock was given, and CPR continued. Paramedic Whittlesey and EMT Lin then transferred patient onto stretcher and initiated transport to the closest hospital. At that time, EMT Rybikov and EMT Dombrowsky had been relieved of their duties and cleared from scene. *****



Scott Dorff EMT/Supervisor/FTO ProTransport-1

On the morning of December 4, 2022, Medic 2 was dispatched code 3 to a motor vehicle accident involving one vehicle. Paramedic David Kolet-Mandrikov along with his partner arrived on scene within 6 minutes of dispatch. On arrival, Paramedic Kolet-Mandrikov observed a local Jackson police officer initiating CPR on the 66-year-old male driver. Due to the mechanism and nature of the incident, he had a high suspicion that the occupant of the vehicle had sustained a medical event that precipitated the vehicle accident. After aggressively working on the patient for over 20 minutes, return of spontaneous circulation was achieved. The patient was placed in full spinal precautions and loaded for transport to the local hospital. During transport, the patient had a normal blood pressure, pulse rate and his respirations were spontaneous and assisted. A 12 lead EKG done in the field revealed a 1st degree heart block. The patient was treated at the local hospital and later flown to UC Davis Medical Center. The patient remained in the ICU on a ventilator for a week. The patient made good progress every day and eventually was discharged home with no deficits. It was determined that the patient had experienced a cardiac event prior to the vehicle accident. The quick actions of Paramedic Kolet-Mandrikov and his recognition that the trauma was not the likely cause of the patient's cardiac arrest led to the successful outcome of this patient.

Upon arrival, EMT Lin and Paramedic Whittlesey transferred patient from stretcher to hospital bed, where hospital staff recovered pulses. *****

After the patient was loaded into the ambulance and began transport, additional shocks were administered, and pulses were then felt. Enroute to the nearest hospital, CPR remained in progress. Upon arrival, EMT Lin and Paramedic Whittlesey transferred patient from stretcher to hospital bed, where hospital staff recovered pulses. *****



Justin Williams Paramedic Butte County EMS

Paramedic **Justin Williams** was dispatched to a respiratory distress call. Upon arrival, Paramedic Williams found a female in severe respiratory distress who also was 40 weeks pregnant in active labor for the last three days. During his assessment, the patient started to decompensate and stopped breathing. He immediately was able to provide airway and ventilation support for the patient, quickly extricated and transported to the hospital. During transport to the hospital, Paramedic Williams was also delayed by a train, but due to his calm demeanor, quick and decisive actions, and early heads up to the hospital, when the patient made it to the hospital, they were able to immediately intubate and perform an emergency C-Section in the OR. The patient and the baby were discharged home a couple of days later.
