IN MEMORIAM

Mike Williams

A major influencer and benefactor of EMS and trauma care passed away last year at the age of 72. Mike is best known as the Founder and President of The Abaris Group, a leading provider of EMS and trauma consulting in North America.

Mike discovered his love for EMS while growing up in Michigan. He realized that he could save more lives by moving into EMS leadership and influencing the care of all providers than by working on an ambulance. His first management jobs were as the EMS Director for Imperial and Orange Counties from 1974-1980. In Orange County, Mike recognized the need for organized trauma care. He established the first formal trauma system in the United States, creating a network of trauma centers covering the entire county. Following this success, Mike decided to begin consulting to benefit other regions of the country.

In 1980, Mike founded EMS System Design, eventually becoming The Abaris Group. For the next 43 years, Mike and his experienced group of consultants completed over 300 projects in the fields of EMS, trauma, emergency departments, patient throughput, health plans, etc. This led to many great opportunities, serving on several editorial and professional society boards, publishing hundreds of articles, and presenting at numerous national conferences. Some of his proudest accomplishments include creating dozens of new trauma centers, formalizing EMS systems, teaching emergency department design at Harvard, serving as Senior Faculty to The Robert Johnson Foundation, working with the Los Angeles Olympics EMS service, and being a charter member of the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians. The lives saved by Mike Williams are incalculable.

Mike is survived by his wife and business partner, Juliana Williams. Bill Bullard has assumed the role as President of The Abaris Group after serving 20 years as a Senior Vice President. Bill looks forward to continuing Mike's legacy with Abaris.

Eva Ybarra

Effectionately known as Eva, was a genuine and kind-hearted individual who essentially dedicated herself to the community and its people. Eva had a forceful consequence in securing funding for multiple parks and recreational facilities in her hometown of Livingston, California. Her passion for the community's well-being and her desire to make a difference in people's lives led her down a career path in public relations, where her natural talents radiated brightly. This same passion put her right on the doorstep of RIGGS Ambulance Service in Merced County. Eva's personality instantly won over the folks at RIGGS and cemented the decision that she was the right person to fill the role of Community and Public Relations Manager. She catapulted into her position and hit the ground running. Eva's impact at RIGGS and in Merced County was quickly felt. She stepped outside of the box and forged ahead with outreach events that may have gone by the wayside for conventional-style thinkers. The migrant community and many other underprivileged groups benefited from her unorthodox way of thinking. She truly had the desire to reach and spread awareness to every nook and cranny of Merced County, where suddenly the forgotten were no longer forgotten and many lost the fear of dialing 911 in emergency situations, as well as gained the knowledge and importance of good CPR. Eva was taken from us in October 2023, but her impact will continue to be felt throughout the community.



Jason Achterberg Field Supervisor Hall Ambulance Service, Inc.

Jason Achterberg is the Hall Ambulance Field Supervisor of the Year for 2023. He joined Hall Ambulance on August 14, 2007, as a paramedic and worked for several years in the Bakersfield Metro System. In 2017, Achterberg advanced his position in the Company by completing his supervisor training and gaining experience as a relief supervisor. He was promoted to a full-time supervisor position in October 2017. Achterberg has spent six and a half years working as the metro night supervisor. During the past year, Achterberg has made great strides in honing his leadership skills as a field supervisor. He has demonstrated himself as a solid leader by setting an example for others. In 2023, Achterberg responded to 329 calls (142 first responder and 187 ambulance calls). He excelled in his treatment of patients and was perfect in his core competency skills. He did an exceptional job with documentation as well.

Achterberg is well-versed in his supervisory role and has often been found mentoring new supervisors during their training. He received multiple written compliments throughout the year and consistently acknowledged employees he supervised by submitting 60 written compliments. He has established a good working relationship with the fire department and completed multiple fire station visits throughout the year. He also made himself available to work additional shifts as a supervisor in the East Kern and West Kern areas and help on the metro shift when called upon. He had perfect attendance throughout the year 2023. During a recent supervisor meeting, Hall Ambulance President John Surface challenged all supervisors to start helping employees get back to the "Hall Way" of doing business. He asked the supervisor group to pick a topic each night, share it with employees, and help coach them on the "Hall Way." Achterberg took up the challenge and continually met with employees to share his message each night he was on duty. His efforts were apparent in the changes seen in employees, from uniforms to polished boots and the cleanliness of their ambulances. *



Griffin Addicott EMT Royal Ambulance

On October 12, 2023, Griffin Addicott and Alexander Tornero identified and quickly escalated an unsafe situation at a residence following a discharge. When the team arrived on site, they realized that the gas stove was leaking, presenting a potential hazard throughout the residence. Thinking on their feet, they immediately notified the fire department to inspect, air out, and ultimately clear the residence as safe.

Thank you, Griffin and Alexander, for going the extra mile on what might have been an otherwise routine call. Your actions likely saved the patient's life and your willingness to act is greatly appreciated. *



Shannon Agcaoili Field Training Officer Hall Ambulance Service, Inc.

The Hall Ambulance Field Training Officer (FTO) of the Year for 2023 is EMT Shannon Agcaoili. She joined Hall Ambulance on April 16, 1996, and has worked in the Metro response system for most of, if not all, her time with the company. Over the past several years, Agcaoili has stepped up and assisted in training new EMTs. It's the responsibility of the field training officer to take a new EMT, whether that be someone with experience from another EMS system or a brand-new EMT just out of their training, and indoctrinate them into the "Hall Way" of doing business. FTOs spend countless hours teaching patient care, documentation, and radio reports. They also teach their employees how to clean the floor of an ambulance properly, make up a gurney after a call, and do the perfect trifold of a blanket. In 2023, Agcaoili completed training for six different EMTs, totaling 1,295 hours of total training time. *



Amber Allen Emergency Medical Dispatcher AlphaOne Ambulance

On October 23, 2023, as an Emergency Medical Dispatcher, Amber Allen coordinated the response for the AlphaOne crew, led by Paramedic Jason Walther alongside EMTs Dylan Cole, Zachary Renkert, and Luke Moreno. Their outstanding performance during a critical incident at a psychiatric facility showcased exceptional service and medical proficiency. Upon receiving the call regarding a staff member experiencing respiratory distress, the crew was dispatched swiftly. While Amber stayed on the line with the reporting party, she provided reassurance and assisted with maintaining an open airway, while the crew was en route. Once the crew arrived on scene, they quickly identified a pulseless patient receiving CPR from staff members at the facility. Their seamless coordination, from initial call intake to the crew arriving on scene, and rapid deployment of life-saving interventions, including advanced airway management and CPR, led to the achievement of Return of Spontaneous Circulation (ROSC). They then executed a smooth transfer of the stabilized patient to UCDMC, ensuring continuity of care. Amber's reassurance and effective pre-arrival instructions helped lead to the positive patient outcome that ensued after the crew took over care. In essence, the entirety of the team's actions not only saved a life but also underscored the paramount importance of effective emergency medical response in our community. *

What an incredible outcome to a truly terrifying situation. Karen's "CPR For Friends and Family" initiative continues and AlphaOne has now equipped twenty people with the skills and abilities to be the difference between life and death. *

Without hesitation, Nick went back into the hotel, searching for a fire extinguisher. Hotel staff were not able to provide the location of a fire extinguisher, however Nick eventually found one mounted on a wall. Nick, having located the extinguisher ran back across the road and extinguished the flames that had begun to envelop the disoriented man. Nick's intervention averted a potential loss of human life and spared the individual from severe harm. This act of service exemplifies the vital role off-duty EMS personnel play in safeguarding the public. Nick's rapid and decisive response underscores the profound impact first responders can have, even in their everyday lives. In a world where these unsung heroes stand ever-ready, the safety of the public is fortified, and the reach of the EMS community extends beyond the confines of their official duties. *



Jared Cook Paramedic Royal Ambulance

On January 15th, Jared Cook and Connor Rothwell were working a PM ALS shift and were dispatched to back-to-back ECHO calls. During the calls, Jared demonstrated unparalleled professionalism and a level of expertise that is truly commendable. Benjamin Cozens Paramedic/FT0 AlphaOne Ambulance

On Thanksgiving Day 2023, Paramedic Ben Cozens and his EMT partner Dan Cogan were en route to a routine post move. Prior to their arrival at their post, they witnessed a commotion in the street in front of them. Realizing they had just witnessed a massive vehicle accident, they were faced with a critical incident with screaming bystanders and multiple patients with varying degrees of injury. After triaging the scene, Paramedic Cozens identified an 8-year-old female who had been ejected from a vehicle as the most critical of all patients. After ensuring that additional resources were en route, Paramedic Cozens prepared the most critical patient for transport and began life-saving measures. Unable to establish an adequate airway due to extreme hemorrhaging, Paramedic Cozens made the decision to transport to the closest trauma center. Paramedic Cozens, although managing an extremely critical patient, was able to complete the transport successfully. Knowing that this patient's emergency was still in progress and that the patient needed a more appropriate level of care, Ben, along with the charge nurse at the hospital, immediately contacted AlphaOne dispatch and were able to reroute one of the company's critical care transport teams to this higher priority, rapidly evolving situation. Prior to the Critical Care team's arrival, Paramedic Cozens had thought through potential challenges that could have arisen during transport and had secured one of the hospital's ER physicians to maintain patient care until definitive care was reached. Immediately following the patient's stabilization for transport, the Critical Care team, along with Paramedic Cozens and the ER Physician, initiated transport to definitive care. Throughout transport, Paramedic Cozens and the Critical Care team remained focused on patient care and airway management. Upon arrival at the final receiving facility. a transfer of care was completed, and the patient now had the care they needed. We are proud to say that due to the exceptional lifesaving medical treatment and leadership of Paramedic Ben Cozens. a young girl with a potentially life-ending traumatic event, has since made a complete recovery with a full life ahead of her. *

After 15 minutes on scene, The Richmond Fire Department arrived and began assisting with an assessment of the patient's cardiac rhythm and preparing for CPR. Joseph obtained and maintained vitals and patient care management as they packaged and transferred the patient over to the Richmond Fire Department's gurney. He maintained patient care en route to a field landing zone. Upon their arrival, the flight crew successfully performed RSI on the patient, pushing a Ketamine IV via access that Joseph obtained early in the call. They rapidly transferred the patient to their helicopter and transported him via flight. Joseph and Nicholas's guick thought, leadership, and action had an immense impact on this patient's chances for survival after a severe incident. *
